# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The MAHS/MASC Executive Committee met in person for the first time at the Anderson Center at Bethel University on February 26th. The number one agenda item was the upcoming MAHS/MASC state convention. Last year's state convention was canceled due to the Covid pandemic. Karrie Fredrickson, MAHS state advisor and Sartell High School Honor Society advisor, announced that Sartell High School had been given permission to hold an in-person state convention on April 18th. The convention has been modified to meet Covid safety standards. The total number of delegates and advisors will be set at 200. Schools will be limited to three delegates from student council and three delegates from honor society. All significant convention activities will take place on Sunday from 8am to 8pm. This will include Ted Wiese's keynote and activities, election speeches and the candidate forum, idea sharing, big ideas, and a final dinner at 6 pm. Schools that want to stay overnight can book rooms at a convention hotel to be named. Monday morning will have an additional short session after breakfast. MAHS/MASC is grateful for the efforts of Karrie Fredrickson and her student leaders to bring us back to the "new normal!"
