Your Executive Committee has had a busy summer. At the Principals' Summer Leadership Conference Grace Paggen (MAHS Secretary) and Etenesh Bonitto (Conference Coordinator) led two sessions entitled "Student Issues." The panel members came from schools throughout the state. The students shared their thoughts on student stress, racial equity, transgender issues, and distance learning. On August 1 and 2 the Summer Leadership Academy returned to Sauk Rapids-Rice High School after missing last year due to covid shutdowns. Over one hundred students from 17 schools attended. Workshop presenter Terry D'Imperio, national advisor of the year, received high marks for her interactive presentation. Executive committee members led discussions on issues facing students as they start the 2021-22 school year. The evening events moved to the Holiday Inn where students enjoyed swimming, sharing ideas, and finishing the evening with a dance DJ-ed by Hennepin Division President Jack Kopesky and Executive Committee members. I closed the Academy the following morning with a presentation entitled "Your Ten Most Important Words." On August 22 the Executive Committee met at Tech High School in St. Cloud. This is the site of the 2022 state convention. Tech has chosen the theme "Carnival" for the convention. Tech is an impressive brand new school that will be an excellent host site for the March 26-28 convention. The Executive Committee also discussed the state service project that will be announced in this newsletter. On November 7 and 8 the Leadership Forum will return to beautiful Gull Lake at Cragun's Resort. Over 600 students and advisors attended this conference in 2019. 
Alexa Mack MASC President




Jennifer Nguyen MAHS President


Fall Forum Information & Principal Convention

On June 16th, a panel of student leaders from across Minnesota provided two sessions at the Summer Leadership Conference held for secondary principals at Breezy Point, MN. The sessions were titled, "Big Ideas" and covered a wide range of topics impacting students today, such as: experiences during distance learning, stress and mental health services, racism and bias in schools, transgender and LGBTQ issues, and much more. The student panelists shared personal experiences, plus ideas for creating a school culture that uplifts and affirms all students. Several principals shared that hearing directly from student leaders was one of the most impactful parts of their entire conference.
